


CSRS N.C. Veterinary Medical Board Survey Results

Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs (PDMPs) access and usage is defined by legislation at state level. The inclusion of veterinarian generated data is not routine and continues to be debated on a technical level and in relation to the sector's role in the Opioid/Substance Misuse Crisis. After two years with veterinarian's usage of the PDMP, a survey of the technological components was completed; and an in-depth review of beliefs, observations, and education has led to a specific call to action for this sector. Here we show the gaps in understanding of the technological infrastructure as well as illustrating the scale of prescription misuse concerns facing North Carolina Veterinary clinics.


RESPONDENTS USE AN ELECTRONIC RX SERVICE





